Household Pet Emergency Shelter Training Course

This section covers guidelines for setting up and operating a temporary pet emergency shelter in a community. This protocol was designed to assist with the sheltering of household pets belonging to Louisiana residents, recognizing that not all shelters can be co-located or pet-friendly. The goal of this course is to provide the user with a standardized guideline for safe and efficient household pet shelter operation, while guaranteeing that all pets are properly identified, registered and linked to their owners, thus ensuring that they can be reunited if separated. Shelter operators are encouraged to make every effort to prevent separation of pets from their owners and preserve the strength of the human-animal bond.
