DEADLINE to Register is Friday, May 30th, 2025

Participants will be limited to first 20 applicants!

Note: There must be a minimum of 12 participants to hold the training course.

Only persons who have completed this course and passed the examinations can be fully certified as a CAET to perform euthanasia with sodium pentobarbital and be eligible to obtain controlled substance permits from state and federal agencies in order to purchase and maintain controlled substances. If your animal control facility uses sodium pentobarbital for euthanasia of animals, your employees need to possess an active CAET certification to perform euthanasia without a licensed veterinarian on the premises.

It is <u>strongly recommended</u> that applicants for the certification course be <u>familiar</u> with <u>basic</u> CAET procedures before taking this CAET course.

To sign up for the course, one must carefully read the instructions and submit the online application at www.lsbvm.org/app-caet. Along with the online application, the following supplemental documents must be submitted in the application portal: (1) a passport-size photo; (2) payment of all applicable fees; (3) a notarized copy of applicant's valid driver's license *or* a photocopy of applicant's birth certificate; and (4) a copy of one's high school diploma *or* GED certificate *or* official transcript from institution of higher learning. The applicant is also responsible for completing the background check process with the Louisiana State Police per the applicable instructions and forms on the website and have the documents submitted directly to the LBVM. Each person registering for the course will receive more information prior to the course date. The course handbook will be made available to applicants electronically at least two weeks prior to the course.
